Trip to Martha’s Vineyard

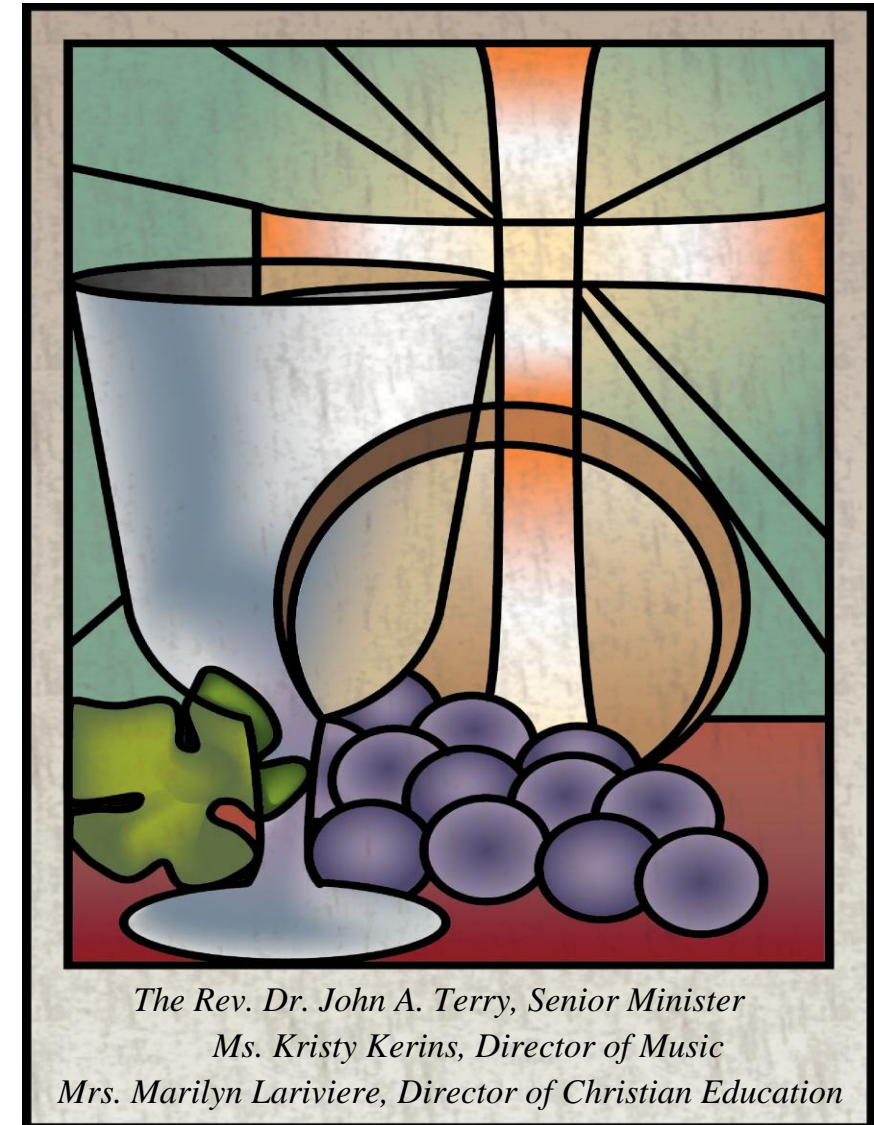
